Not Just a Design: The History of Prairie View's Logo

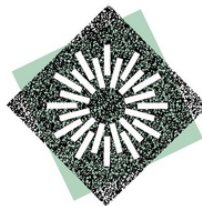
A logo is more than just a picture. It is the heart of an organization's identity. For Prairie View, one element has been part of every logo through the years. Can you guess what it is? People have offered some creative guesses: a star, a quilt block, and yes, even an ashtray. (We are not making that up.)

Here is the story behind Prairie View's logo.

Since 1964, Prairie View's logo has featured a sunburst, created by Newton artist Robert Regier. It stands for more than just a bright design:

- **The Place:** highlighting Prairie View's location, where you can experience the full beauty of the prairie sun.
- **The Meaning:** the sun as a source of light, warmth, and healing.
- **The Spirit:** a nod to faith, inspired by Malachi's words: "But unto you that fear my name shall the sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings."

The logo evolved over time. For the 25th anniversary, it was refreshed to show that some things change while others stay the same. In 2013, the design was updated again with cleaner lines, modern fonts, and colors that capture the blue skies and green fields of the prairie.
